

Daily Advancement – The Rolled Up Trouser Leg



The rolled up trouser leg and exposed breast is always something that people seem to know about Freemasonry and often use it as a source of amusement, however it does allude back to our predecessors who did not wear long trousers like we do today. In those days, masons wore knee breeches and long leather aprons to protect themselves.

If a young man wanted to become an entered Apprentice he first had to prove himself as a fit and proper person to the arduous job of a stonemason.

Physically he needed to show he was male (by showing a breast), that he had good arms (the sleeve rolled up) and that his legs were sound (the modern day trouser leg).

So why the need to do the trouser leg today? The long held tradition, probably stemming from ancient Jewish times, was one of making a promise on the Bible on 'bare and bended knee', and just as people take off their shoes in a holy place, it is a mark of respect and sincerity.

In some lodges, such as at Leopold lodge in Scarborough, a candidate for initiation is required to be 'neither naked or clad' and is required to change in to a special white suit which has the knees exposed and breast laid open with short sleeve. The white suit also indicated that he is poor and penniless.

In some lodges even the candidate is sat in a room alone for an hour where he writes down his reason for becoming a mason – this is known as a chamber of reflection.
