Daily Advancement The Shriners



During my travels in the USA, I was struck by some fundraising activity by a group of casually dressed me wearing red Fezzes! It was pointed out to me that they are Shriners. Intrigued I looked it up and discovered that they are a side order of Freemasonry in North America, indeed you have to be a Master Mason to join.

They describe themselves as a fraternity 'based on fun, fellowship, and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth.

The order known for its colourful middle Eastern themes, iconography and ceremonies it used to be known as the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine (hence the more common term Shriners). Since September 11th the order has toned down it's middle eastern connections and it is now known as Shriners International.

The membership still boasts around 200,000 members (across 200 chapters) and it is known for it's service to the community, philanthropic work and fundraising, particularly hospitals for children – there are 22 across North America and Mexico!

The order was founded in New York City in 1872 and is now headquartered in Tampa, Florida.
