The Inner Guard



It seems odd in a ceremony that the Worshipful Master addresses the Junior Warden to ask if the lodge is secured (or tyled) – why not just ask the inner guard direct, after all he is stood right there! The answer lies with the operative masons as in the old days operative or guild lodges didn't have an Inner Guard and the Junior Warden had the responsibility of getting up and seeing what the Tyler wanted.

The word guard has the same meaning as warden and means 'a keeper or attender'. The first recorded use of a 'Door Keeper' was in 1734 at the Old Kings Arms Lodge No 28. The position was usually occupied by the most recent member - the youngest apprentice. He operated under the control of the Outer Guard or Tyler and was recorded as an 'assistant to the Tyler'. Believe it or not, like the Tyler he was also entitled to receive an allowance - Those were the days! He received one schilling for each lodge night and one schilling for every newly initiated brother – now there's an incentive!

In the 19th century the 'Door Keeper' or 'Inner Tyler' started to be referred to as Guard or Guarder. In 1814 the position was officially recognised as an office and five years later he got a jewel – the crossed swords (as above). The ritual was also adapted and formalised so that the Junior Warden asked the Inner Guard to perform the task.

Like the old days the inner guard is the first rung on the ladder and the role is undertaken by one of the newest members of the lodge.
