Masonic Charitable Foundation

The Province of Yorkshire North & East Ridings (PYNER) Festival 2029 is now in to its first year and all of us are encouraged to raise funds for this important festival. The Festival 2029 has chosen to support the grants and services provided by the Masonic Charitable Foundation (MCF) as the next beneficiary. Many of the readers will be experiencing their first festival so in advance of next months meeting, let's find out a bit more.

What is the Festival?

The 2029 festival is a province wide five year fund raising festival that occurs every five years. Previous festivals have raised funds for Prostate Cancer Research and funds for the Masonic School for Girls and Boys and raises in excess of £1million over the five year period. The 2029 recipient is the MCF.

What is the MCF?

Charity is one of the core principals of Freemasonry, with the first charity committee formed in 1725. The MCF was created in 2016 by bringing together four separate charities ran by United Grand Lodge in London: -

The Freemasons Grand Charity, The Royal Masonic Trust for Girls and Boys, The Masonic Samaritan Fund and The Royal Masonic Benevolent Institution.

Who do they Support?

This is our charity and one we are rightly proud of as it also looks after us. The foundation provides support to Freemasons and their families who have a financial, health, education or care need - In 2022 – 2023 in our province, 114 freemasons and family members were helped with grants.

The MCF also provides grants for local and national charities and in each year around 500 charities are supported with grants totalling more than £5.5 million. In our province alone £106,600 was given to charities in 2022 - 2023.

The foundation also provides a relief chest scheme to enable individuals or lodges to manage donations, such as regular direct debits. For example you can set up a regular monthly direct debit of £10.00 per month for 60 months that would go towards the PYNER Festival 2029. In return for your support and generosity, you will become a festival steward and receive a special festival jewel which can be worn at regular lodge meetings. You can also purchase a special festival tie.

- Lifelites Helping children with life limiting and life-threatening conditions.
